

## The Prince of Wales Medal for Arts Philanthropy

The Prince of Wales Medal for Arts Philanthropy was first awarded in 2008. The medal recognises a sustained contribution to our nation's cultural life over a period of time, or a major gift.



The Medal is awarded to five individuals or couples each year. The first honourees were Dame Vivien Duffield CBE, Roger De Haan, Dr Carol Høgel CBE, Mr Martin & Carmel Naughton and Lord & Lady Sainsbury.

Last year's honourees were Michael and Dorothy Hintze, Dr Keith Howard, Donald MacDonald CBE and Louise MacDonald, Mrs Mary Weston CBE, Sir John Zochonis.

### Nomination Details

The nomination must take the form of a completed nomination form and a signed letter of support from the chair or chief executive of the arts organisation. This should give precise reasons as to why their nominee should be a recipient of the Medal.

### Nomination Guidelines

- The Prince of Wales Medal for Arts Philanthropy is awarded in recognition of a sustained contribution to our nation's cultural life over a period of time, or in recognition of a major gift.
- Recipients can be UK or foreign nationals and may support cultural activities in the United Kingdom or of UK artists or organisations presented overseas.
- Nominations will be confidential, as in the National Honours. We advise arts organisations not to inform nominees to avoid disappointment. All judges involved in the selection process will sign a letter of confidentiality.

# Arts & Business

- Arts organisations can nominate up to three living individuals or couples for the Medal. If not selected, the individuals or couples may be nominated in subsequent years.
- Applications should consist of a completed nomination form and supporting letter. No further supporting information should be sent.
- A couple will be deemed to be one nomination.
- The term 'arts' includes the performing arts, visual arts, crafts, photography, literature, music, museums and galleries, film and moving image and heritage.

A group of distinguished artists will select the final recipients, following a short listing process undertaken by a panel of chief executives in The Prince of Wales's Arts Advisory Group.
